

The 14th International Symposium on Wireless Personal Multimedia Communications

WPMC'2011, Communications, Networking and Applications for the Internet of Things

The Wireless Personal Multimedia Communications Symposium aims at enabling collaboration in the field of wireless information and multimedia communications. Held in Asia, Europe and America, WPMC has established itself as a unique global conference dedicated to wireless multimedia convergence. WPMC'11 is a meeting ground for specialists contributing to "Communications, Networking and Applications for the Internet of Things" - the theme for WPMC'11.

Proposals for workshops are invited for affiliation with WPMC'11. **WPMC'11 Workshops will address clearly focused topics, pertinent to the main conference.** They can give the opportunity to present novel ideas in a less formal way than the conference itself, to obtain feedback on it. They should offer **emerging interest to the wireless research community and bridge it with other areas.**

Workshop organizers are responsible for establishing a program committee, collecting and evaluating submissions, notifying authors of acceptance or rejection in due time, and ensuring a transparent and fair selection process, organizing selected papers into sessions, and assigning session chairs.

Researchers and practitioners are invited to submit a one-page workshop proposal to the WPMC'11 Workshop Chair, November 30, 2010. **Submissions should be made by e-mail with "WPMC Workshop Proposal" in the subject header** and must supply all the data on the Preliminary Workshop Proposal Format.

The selection of the workshops to be included in the final WPMC program will be based upon several factors, including the scientific / technical interest of the topics, the quality of the proposal, balance and distinctness of workshop topics, and the capacity of the conference workshop program. Further consideration will be given whether the proposal addresses the technical theme of WPMC'11.

WPMC 2011 Workshop Proposal Format (Limited to 1-page, typed double space in 11 pt Times New Roman)

1. Workshop title
2. Primary organizers, their affiliation, and contact details
3. Proposed duration (select one: 1 / 2 / 3 / 4 sessions; 1 session=90 minutes)

4. A statement of goals for the workshop
5. Workshop theme
6. Likely participants (expected number of participants and a list of at least ten people which could be interested in submitting a paper)
